LOVING RELATIONSHIPS

How do people inside and outside the Church know the worshippers at Central Baptist Church are Christians? Do they know we are Jesus followers because of our doctrines? Are they convinced we love God and people because of our enthusiastic spirituality? Do they look at our beautiful building and sanctuary to sense our loving relationships? Are outsiders convinced we are Christians by our charity and mission projects? **No!** Jesus said, “A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another” (John 13:34-35). Loving relationship in Jesus’ name defines and distinguishes the Church from other social agencies and civic groups.

There is a difference between being a “friendly” church and being a “loving” church! Friendly churches welcome and greet people but remain distant; loving churches care for one another through close relationships of concern, encouragement and compassion. Healthy churches create an atmosphere of genuine joy, love and caring. They are places where conflicts are resolved according to Jesus’ teachings in Matthew 18. God wants Central Baptist to become a “loving” Church!

Our latest Natural Church Development survey results show our “minimum factor” is “loving relationships.” Natural Church Development (NCD) is a process to increase the health of a church that pinpoints where to focus attention to improve health and release greater growth potential. It is a spiritual journey that involves people and empowers them to make positive changing in their congregation. The main objective is to increase the overall health of a congregation by measuring eight Quality Characteristics: empowering leadership, gift-oriented ministry, passionate spirituality, functional structure, inspiring worship, holistic small groups, need-oriented evangelism and loving relationships. The Church Health Team will meet with our NCD Coach to review the results and develop a strategic plan to increase our minimum factor over the next eighteen months.

SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL - The Ministry of Children team has decided to do all elementary children's Sunday school classes together this

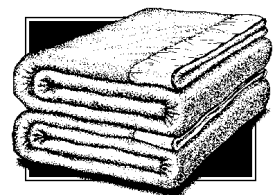

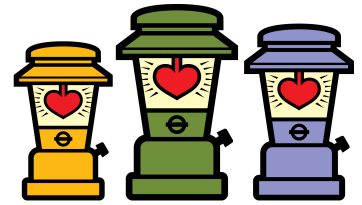
HANDICAP BUS RIDE TO CHURCH – The

Camp Emmanuel is a lovely, quiet area with a fishing lake, plenty of room to walk, play, and most importantly, fellowship with a variety of ages. The center of activity is the Lodge building. There is a Chapel upstairs where we have Sunday morning Worship, and downstairs is the kitchen, dining hall, and activity room. The activity room is the site of non-stop ping-pong tournaments, and late night games and conversation with plenty of popcorn and other goodies.

Lodging consists of spaces (with hook-ups) for campers or tents, rustic bunkhouses & cabins (you will need to bring your own bedding). 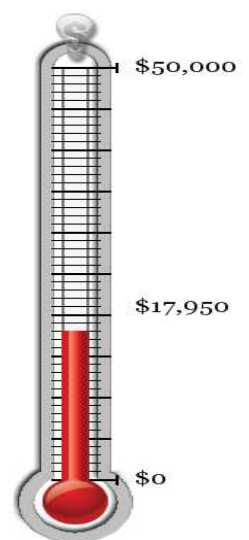

REPORT FROM THE REGIONAL MISSION CONFERENCE

- The Conference at Cherry Hills Baptist Church opened on Friday with Revs. Taku & Katie Lonkumer. They will be going back to N.E. India when they reach 100% of the financing they need. It has taken them a year to reach 90%. They hope to leave in the fall. Taku was raised by a tribe of head hunters. Taku and Katie met in Hawaii, and married in India and they have 2 boys and a girl all in their 20's. They came to the US in 2001 and are now getting to ready to go back to India since their children are raised. They showed slides of their ministry in India. India is a multi culture country. 25 years of ministry and they have 29 churches. They will be working with Lay Leaders in India. Taku's grandmother was the 1st to convert to Christianity in her village. His Grandfather donated land to build a new Christian village. His Dad started Kindergarten at the age of 18-19. Taku started when he was 12. His father became a missionary. India is mostly Hindu then Muslim. India has 2.8 million American Baptist members. Churches are growing mostly by Lay leaders. The churches start with 5 or 6 members, when it reaches 20 it is a church. Building roads from India to Turkey and Burma will open more doors for Christianity and trade by 2020. Taku and Katie will not be going as missionaries but as development workers.

In the evening session Friday we were treated by a special group from Bacone College Gospel Choir. 8 might voices of young people and a very exceptional piano player.

The Rev. Dr. Stan Slade was the evening speaker who spent time in El Salvador during a difficult time. He does workshops in Kenya using the books from the US. At this

conference 200 boxes of books totaling 7000 lbs. was donated and taken to Cincinnati, Ohio to be distributed around the world. Also a conversion van was overflowing with canned goods and another vehicle had to be used to haul the donated food.

Dr. Slade spoke on Whose Face to Place on the gospel—Could be Many. God does mission work person to person, face to face. We are called to be merciful and precious people. He used pictures of faces to tell the story of Jacob, who he called Jake the Snake, (Starting with Genesis 25 and 32).

On Saturday we went to 2 workshops. One being the Murrow Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, OK. Beth Martin is the new Executive Director. She is doing a very good job for only being there a year and a half. Murrow Home receives Title 1 funds to help the children develop their reading and math skills through tutoring, computers, and other educational material.

They are in the process of saving Campbell's Soup Labels in order to purchase a new van. The UPC code and the point value are the only part of the label that is required. They need 1,600,000 points to purchase this van. As Beth was getting ready to leave for this conference she received a phone call from a man in Tennessee wanting to know if they needed a van. The answer was yes so he is donating a used van to them. But they are still in need of a new one.

The other session we attended was about Bacone College, founded in 1880. It is one of the oldest colleges in OK. Last fall they had the highest enrollment in history of 1,184. Cherry Hills Baptist Church is the largest supporter of Bacone College. Bacone is a

strong American Baptist Church College. It is not a small Native American School anymore. It is different from 10-20 years ago. The new Bacone is getting better and growing every year.

As a new Baptist this conference was an experience to see the uplifting of the Baptist faith in everyone there. I understand the Baptist faith more by going to this conference. The speakers were not what I expected but they were truly inspiring and everyone of them was an inspiration to me. I would recommend for you if you have never been to one. Cherry Hills did a remarkable job being host to this group. The food and the hospitality were great.
