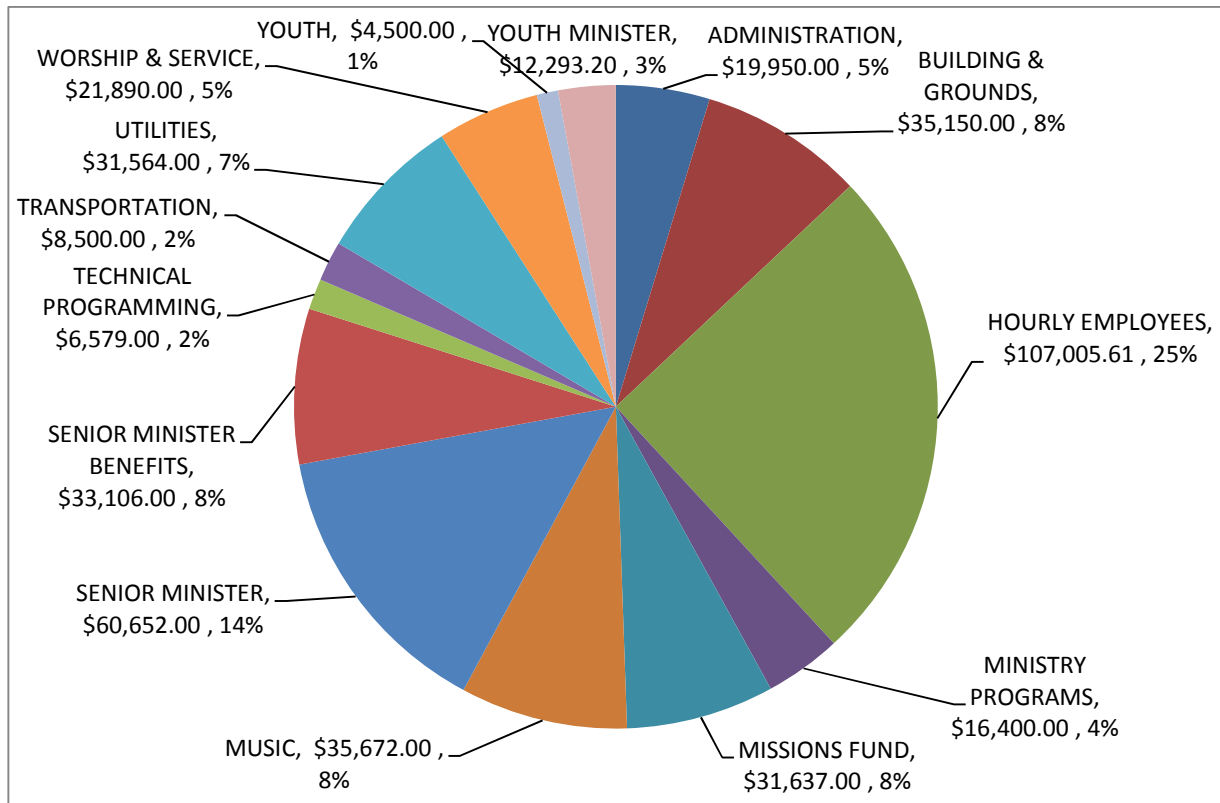

SUPPORT GOD'S VISION OF MINISTRY AT CENTRAL BAPTIST CHURCH!

Charles Schulz has managed to amuse and bridge generations with his characters, Charlie Brown, Lucy, Linus, Pig Pen, and company. With their own special brand of charm, they often provoke laughter and pause for thought, as Lucy constantly doles out unsolicited advice. You may remember the episode when Charlie Brown seeks psychiatric advice from Lucy. Lucy tells Charlie Brown that life is like a deck chair on the cruise ship of life. What you have to decide, Lucy says, is whether you want your deck chair to face backward so you can see where you have been, or if you want your deck chair to face forward so you can see where you are going. Exasperated, Charlie Brown responds, "I'm having trouble just getting my deck chair unfolded!"

We are a blessed congregation with our deck chairs facing forward. The Permanent Ministries submitted their visions for the coming year with faces forward, into the future God has for us.



ADMINISTRATION (\$19,950.00) – Your servants in the Office will provide professional service and communication. We will pay our bank charges, maintain office equipment, purchase paper and other office supplies for the bulletin, newsletter and meetings, pay for postage, and professional accounting fees.

BUILDING & GROUNDS (\$35,150.00) – Because of faithful members in the past, God blessed us with an outstanding building as our mission center where we can gather for worship, host dinners, train leaders, disciple children, and pray. As good stewards we will maintain, insure, and update God's mission center so we can share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

HOURLY EMPLOYEES (\$107,005.61) - We are pleased to have an outstanding Executive Secretary (Karen Dietrich), Church Custodian (John Christ), Stewardship Secretary (Jim Mealiff), Choir Director (Rexanne Greuter), Organist (Margaret Mealiff) and nursery workers (Carol Johnson and Clair Smith) who partner with our leaders to serve God, together. We take great joy in supporting our dedicated staff with a moderate 4.0% hourly raise and benefits as they provide leadership, organization, and direction for our congregation.

MINISTRY PROGRAMS (\$16,400.00) – Working with God the Holy Spirit we have a variety of ministries that lead, teach, care for, and prepare our members for ministry and service. Together we will welcome and train people in Jesus' name through ministries of leadership, education and discipleship, BuGs children, Vacation Bible School, Sunday school, Bible studies, small groups, CHUPPERS, Family Camp, and other new ministries.

MISSIONS FUND (\$31,637.00) - God blesses us. In grateful response we generously give our first fruits back to God for His work beyond our walls. In doing this the Church models **TITHING**. These mission dollars will support our:

- **Local Partners:** Addicts Victorious, Care Net Pregnancy, Church Women United Blanket Sunday, Madonna House, New Start Rescue Mission, Honor Flight, PET Project, Quanada, Quincy Soup Kitchen, Right To Life Penny Campaign, Salvation Army and the Unmet Need Committee.
- **Regional Partners:** The leaders and 380 sister churches in Illinois and Missouri known as the American Baptist Churches of the Great Rivers Region.
- **National Partners:** Alaska Baptist Children's Home, Bacone College, Baptist Joint Committee on Public Affairs, Evangelical Seminary of Puerto Rico, Green Lake Conference Center, Judson University, Kodiak Baptist Mission, Lake Springfield Baptist Camp, Murrow Indian Children's Home, and Northern Baptist Theological Seminary.
- **International Partners:** Baptist World Alliance, Church World Service, One Great Hour of Sharing (disaster relief and development), International Ministries, and our five special interest missionaries: Wendy Bernhard, in Congo, Africa; Deliris Carrion in Haiti; Jeff & Annie Dieselberg in Thailand; Ruth Mooney in Costa Rica; and Charles & Sarah West in Africa.

MUSIC (\$35,672.00) – Central Baptist leads the community in Music Ministry. We want to continue to strengthen our vision of having the best Chancel Choir, Hand Bell Choir,

Traditional and Contemporary Worship services in Quincy. ***The Church Council cast the vision of hiring a full-time Ministry of Worship to lead the Worship Band in 2012.*** We also plan to host more Southern Gospel concerts.

SENIOR MINISTER (\$60,652.00) – The Pastoral Relations Committee and the Diaconate approved a generous 10% raise for our Senior Minister. The congregation provides the Pastor a cash salary and housing allowance, along with a social security offset.

SENIOR MINISTER BENEFITS (\$33,106.00) – The congregation provides for our full time pastor with health insurance for the family, continuing education, mileage reimbursement, and retirement benefits for life through our denomination's Ministers and Missionaries Benefit Board.

TECHNICAL PROGRAMMING (\$6,579.00) – The worship educational programs purchase a Christian Copyright License to broadcast lyrics, upgrade computers, maintenance equipment, purchase small tech items, order a video copyright to show children movies, and upgrade and maintain video and sound equipment.

TRANSPORTATION (\$8,500.00) – The Trustees cut costs this year by leasing a bus from the school district on Wednesday nights. The bus ministry uses approximately \$120.00 in fuel each week to transport persons to worship and Sunday school. The church will continue these important ministries.

UTILITIES (\$31,564.00) – Utilities costs are rising for individuals and churches. Our average electric / gas bill is \$2,300.00 per month. We will also pay for internet, telephone, trash, and water service.

WORSHIP & SERVICE (\$21,890.00) – Worshipping and serving God is the heart of our ministry. The Deacons and Deaconesses will continue to provide baby and wedding showers for members, order communion supplies, decorate the sanctuary, welcome first time visitors, send birth and funeral flowers, host funeral dinners, host a stewardship campaign, secure offering envelopes, outreach to the public, provide pulpit supply, continue the Radio Ministry at \$70.00 per week, host special services like the Revival, purchase the Secret Place devotionals for our shut ins, print worship bulletins, and maintain other worship service supplies.

YOUTH PROGRAM (\$4,500.00) – Youth are the Church. We want to provide our youth group with solid Bible studies, authentic friendships and memorable trips to SKWIM, Youth Christians Weekend, Green Lake Conference Center and Church Camp.

YOUTH MINISTER (\$12,293.20) – Rev. Cedric Allen works fifteen hours per week leading Sunday mornings, Wednesday nights, and the Student Leadership Team.

The vision of ministry will cost \$424,898.81. This is our vision of God working in and through us as we share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in local, national and international settings. Our congregation is on record as **REALLY** wanting to follow Jesus. Therefore, let us give ourselves first to the Lord; then, to one another in ministry. May God always be praised!

The Ministry of Trustees will host our annual Consecration Sunday Catered Luncheon on November 13 at 12:30 p.m. Please make a reservation for this special catered meal (not a carry-in) in worship or by contacting the Church Office.

This week, also give some thought to what you see ahead. Try to describe one or two things you would like to see happen in our church, which contributes to fulfilling our God-given mission. I am eager to see how God is speaking through our hearts, as we express and share our hopes and visions for the future.

Use the enclosed Vision Card to write down these things and bring it with you on Sunday, November 6, and someone will be in the foyer to receive it. Your card will be added to our growing, inspiring displays throughout the church. I hope you have been able to see some of the member comments on various displays. We will have additional blank Heart Cards available in worship. What are your hopes and visions for our church?

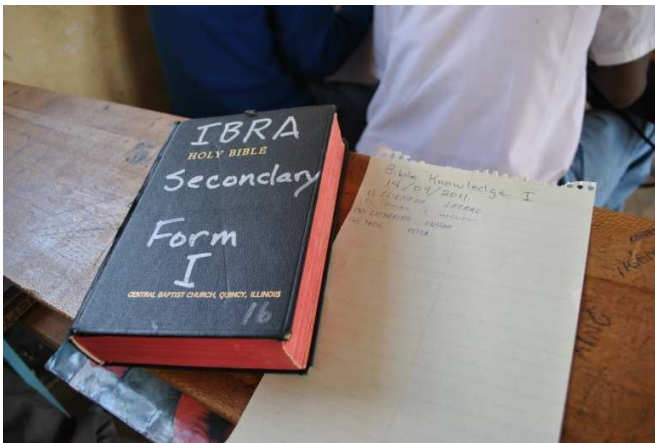

USED BIBLE IN AFRICA TEACHING MUSLIMS ABOUT CHRISTIANITY – Pastor

Ivan was surprised to receive an email and

picture on Thursday, September 29, 2011 at 1:36 PM of a used Bible from Central Baptist Church from a youth minister's recent trip to Tanzania, Africa.

Joel B Miller, Associate Pastor of Youth at Logan Street Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon, Illinois [www.loganstreetbaptist.org, 618-244-4100, 267-733-4181] sent an electronic message to Rev. Greuter on Thu 9/29/2011 1:36 PM: "Pastor Ivan E. Greuter, My church just recently arrived home from a mission trip to Africa. While we were there we visited a Muslim secondary school named IBRA. There is a missionary there teaching a Bible knowledge class. The Bibles they were using had you churches name on them and I took a few pictures that I thought you might want to put up somewhere. Not sure how they got there but I thought it may be interesting to try to figure out how Bibles from your church ended up in Kondo, Tanzania at a Muslim school. Let me know if you can find anything out, it may be an interesting story to tell."



In 2009, Central Baptist Church of Quincy collected used Bibles, hymnals, religious reference books, and Sunday school curriculum from members and the Church classrooms. Twelve boxes of used Bibles were delivered to our mission partner, The Used

Book Depository, at a regional mission conference in Springfield, Illinois. The Used Book Depository is a ministry of the Montgomery Community Church, 11251 Montgomery Rd., Cincinnati, Ohio 45249 [http://www.mcc.us].

Volunteers at The Used Book Depository, "collect used Bibles, hymnals, Christian periodicals and reference materials; we repair damaged books, and send them overseas." They sorted and shipped the Bibles to missionaries in Tanzania.

"We are overjoyed that our used Bibles can bring the message of Jesus to people in the world," said Rev. Greuter. "We are still collecting used Bibles and hymnals."
