## WORLD MISSION OFFERING

## CHILDREN'S MINISTRY NEWS

**MEDICAL RELEASE FORMS** - Every child who enters the nursery, attends Sunday school, and/or attends **BuGs Bible Club** on Wednesday night needs a medical release form on file in the office for the 2011-2012 program year. Medical release forms for children can be found in the nursery, at the "Kids Korner" booth, and on the church website by clicking "Keep Our Kids Safe" under the heading "Children's Ministry." adults who work with children or youth need to fill out a medical release form for themselves; this is also located on the web site.

**CANS 4 KIDS** – The Environmental Protection Agency estimates that “51% of all aluminum cans were recovered for recycling in 2009.” Pounds of aluminum still fill our landfills and waste centers. Therefore,



Central Baptist Church will collect aluminum cans to recycle. Cans will be collected and taken to the recycling center to trade in the cans for cash to fund the children's program. From July 31 – August 5, 8 youth were at the church by 7:30 AM, beginning the trek to the Murrow Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, Oklahoma. Thanks to those who made food donations and prepared the road trip meal to help lower our expenses. Enduring the 100 degree plus temperature, the youth worked in the mornings and early afternoons. In the evenings, to stay cool, the youth enjoyed some water games and a stroll on the campus of Bacone College.

- Cleaning of cottages and rooms
- Reorganizing office filing cabinets

- Move staff office to another location
- Wash company vehicles
- Debris removal on property
- Hedge trimming and grass cutting

The “Million for Muskogee” Campbell Soup Labels will be our goal to collect for our Mission Project for next year. The labels will help make purchases of items needed for the children and programming needs of the orphanage.

We are already on the calendar to return to Muskogee in June 2012.

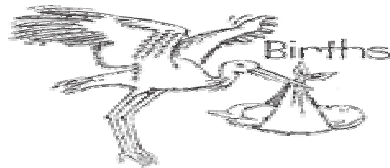

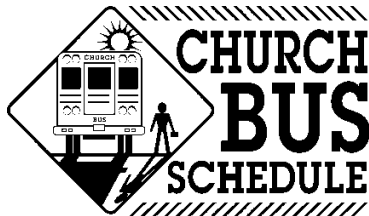
to Clare and Matt Smith on the birth of their newborn son, **Gideon James Smith.**

- **SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons, markers, stamp and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring books, and picture books.
- **HYGIENE ITEMS:** Toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

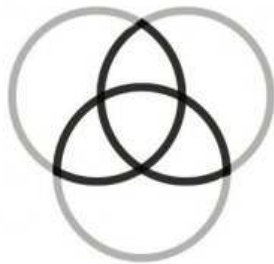

### A MESSAGE FROM MISSIONARY KRISTY

**ENGEL: Be still and know...** Over the last several months I have been learning to rest and to take a deep breath. I have written several times about breathing deeply, relaxing and peace and yet found in myself an inability to actually practice what I preached! These last few months of continued rest and time to just take care of me has been incredibly helpful and I am so thankful to have a mission and support team behind me that recognizes the importance of making sure that I keep myself healthy. During this time of rest, I have been participating in a type of restorative yoga called Atma-Jayam. It's not the super twisty or crazy hothouse yoga that many people know. Instead, it's literally a 60 minute class focused on breathing, stretching and REST. Our instructor, also a Christian, told us recently that if our mind starts to wander during the class we could use a phrase to bring us back to the present moment. My phrase became, "Be still." I often found my mind moving from one thing to another, making plans, thinking about what I could do after class and everything I needed to get done for the day. In doing that, I lost the moment I had in class to just rest...to breathe...to be thankful for the quiet moment I had. I am much better at letting myself rest these days and not feeling guilty about taking care of me. It doesn't mean I am not excited about returning to La Romana very soon but I appreciate these times of quiet and hope that each of you will also learn to find times to rest.
